For the purpose of this conference, Sail Freight is defined as "The maritime movement of cargo under primarily wind power" and small vessels include those up to 500 gross tons.

The Submission Deadline for papers is 31 March 2022. The museum is seeking papers on the following topics for presentation at this conference:

1. US Coast Guard Captaincy Requirements For Sail Freight.
2. Small Vessel Selection And Design For Sail Freight.
3. Dock And Port Infrastructure For Small Sailing Cargo Vessels.
4. Sustainable First And Last Mile Transportation Options For Sail Freight.
5. Training Programs For Sail Freight Crew.
6. Overviews Of Sail Freight Support Projects In The Northeastern US.
7. Means Of Calculating Fossil Fuel Avoidance From Inland And Coastal Sail Freight.
8. Other pertinent topics for small sailing vessels employed in cargo movement on inland and coastal waters.

Presenters will have 30 minute segments with 15 minute breaks between sessions for questions and answers, with longer segments possible by request.
